Dear Residents,

A number of residents have called Village Hall concerning parking at the various train stations. There is limited parking at these stations but there are a number of commuter buses run by Westchester County that pass through Ardsley and do meet commuter trains throughout the rush hour and also during the day. The Village Clerk will send you the schedule upon request.

There was also concern that Dobbs Ferry would no longer issue non-resident parking permits. I spoke to the Mayor of Dobbs Ferry and this system will continue at least through June.

VILLAGE ELECTIONS - Village elections for Mayor and two Trustees will take place on WEDNESDAY, March 18, 1987, between the hours of 6:00 A.M. and 9:00 P. Voting will take place in the Village at the following locations:

1. Municipal Building - For 24th and 53rd Districts

24th District - area South of Ashford Avenue

53rd District - area on North side of Ashford Avenue including all streets running North from Ashford Avenue or accessible North from Ashford Avenue up to and including the Northern end of Kensington Road and Abington Avenue to that point.

2. Episcopal Church (located at intersection of Heatherdell Road and Revolutionary Road) - For 25th and 54th Districts

54th District - area from Abington Avenue from the North side of the Northern intersection with Kensington Road to the South side of Heatherdell Road and the area South of Heatherdell Road including all streets running South from Heatherdell Road or accessible South from Heatherdell Road.

25th District - area North of Heatherdell Road

Please note the special WEDNESDAY election date this year! MARCH 18, 1987

Absentee Ballots - If you will be unavoidably absent from Ardsley during the voting hours (6:00 A.M. to 9:00 P.M.) on March 18, 1987, and desire to cast your vote, you must apply for an absentee ballot. The following procedures must be followed.

1. A request in writing for an application for an absentee ballot must be received by the Village Clerk not later than March 10, 1987.
2. Upon receipt of the proper application (be sure to fill out completely), the Village Clerk will return an absentee ballot to the applicant, in no case, however, after March 11, 1987.
3. Requests for absentee ballots may be made in person to the Village Clerk through March 17, 1987.
4. The completed absentee ballot must be received by the Village Clerk not later than March 18, 1987.

To avoid confusion in casting your vote for the candidates, please note the following:

Village Mayor: A voter may select only one of the candidates.

Village Trustees: A voter may select any two of the candidates without regard to columns or rows. In other words, a voter may choose the two candidates from the same column, or from the same row, or from different columns or rows. This differs from national elections where only one candidate from each column can be selected.

REMINDER ABOUT BOOKS

HOUSE NUMBERS: We all must agree that clearly visible house numbers are extremely important. This is true when company is expected but is critical in an emergency. Valuable time can be lost in responding to an emergency when house numbers are missing or not immediately evident. It is wise to check our house numbers from the street. If they are not clearly distinguishable, they are too small or not sufficiently contrasting, or both. If possible, choose a location for the numbers that can also be seen easily at night. Properly sized and constructed numbers are easy to obtain and simple to install. The few moments it takes to check and correct the problem will be more than worth it by far.

SUMMER EMPLOYMENTS - The Village of Ardsley is in need of summer seasonal help. Positions for high school and college students are available in the highway department, community beautification program and parks department (tennis and snack bar attendants). The parks department positions would include week-end hours. Positions pay \$3.50 - \$4.00 per hour. If interested, please stop by Village Hall before April 1st.
