Dear Residents,

An unfounded rumor has been circulating that I am moving from Ardsley. I am definitely not moving and will continue to serve you, the residents of the Village.

Many of you have spoken to me of your concerns about the number of trees that were cut down as a result of the Flood Control Project. I share your concerns but the removal of the trees was necessary for the project as designed by the Army Corps of Engineers.

The area in back of the Ambulance Corps and Library buildings is also part of the project. The stream that runs between the Nursery School and the Ambulance Corps building will be redirected behind the Ambulance Corps and Library buildings and then go underground into the New York City aqueduct tunnel near the Library parking lot.

Over 700 trees and shrubs will be planted in the final phase of the project which is scheduled to be completed in the Fall of 1989.

A dramatic renovation is progressing on Center Street. The former DPW garage is being converted to our new Community Center and we are looking forward to the grand opening in late September or early October.

Village Hall is also undergoing a renovation. A fire bay is being added to the east side of the building to accommodate our new pumper/ladder truck which will arrive in the Fall. Police headquarters will be renovated and expanded and a new entrance to Village Hall will be created.
