

NEW HOUSES STARTED IN WESTCHESTER AREA

Details of two housing developments in Westchester County, one in the village of Ardsley and the other at Bronxville Heights off Central Avenue in Yonkers, were announced yesterday.

At Ardsley excavation has been started on the first of twenty-two homes of a group of 250 which have been designed by Max Wechsler, architect. They are being built by Diol Bilt Homes, Inc., and will be of frame as well as masonry. To be sold in the \$10,000 price range, the houses will be two stories in height with an expansion attic on the second floor.

The section of Ardsley in which these houses are being built is known as Beacon Hill and has historical interest dating from the Revolutionary days. Streets in the development will commemorate this historic interest with such names as Captain Honeywell's Road, Chimney Pot Lane, Major Applebey's Road, Beacon Hill Road, Flint Lock Lane and Powder Horn Road.

Houses in the Yonkers development will be built solely for veterans of the recent war or members of the armed forces, according to Robert Beckley, White Plains broker, who has been appointed sales agent for the property. Of the thirty-three five-room houses to be erected here, the first group of twelve is now under construction.
