MESSAGE FROM MAYOR JAY LEON

It's been a tumultuous month in our small village. Let's take some time out to discuss some of the positive events that are taking place:

Community Policing The Ardsley Village Board, in Police Chief conjunction with Califano and through a contractual Police agreement with the Benevolent Association, have designated Police Officer Anthony Vacca as our official Community Policing Officer. PO Vacca commands a genuine rapport with our kids along with an air of trust and authority. His schedule has been freed up so he can spend the bulk of his time working along with Youth Advocate Allison our DeLuca to prevent the pervasive problem of underage drinking and drug abuse. Tony is an exceptional person, and Ardsley is extremely lucky to have him as a member of our police force.

Traffic Issues – On June 2nd and 3rd, the long awaited re-striping of Ashford Avenue finally took place. Vehicles will now be able to cross Route 9A onto the Ashford Avenue bridge two cars at a time. Our traffic consultant has indicated this should help alleviate the long backups we sometime experience along Ashford Avenue headed west-bound, and will help traffic headed south-bound on Route 9A that is headed toward Dobbs Ferry to stack up two at a time more readily on the bridge. change, along with the new signal light installed at Ashford and Route 9A last December, represent the first time in anyone's memory where the New York State Dept. of Transportation made an improvement in Ardsley for the purpose of traffic improvement (as opposed to for strictly safety considerations). Our next goal is a follow-up to our request for New York State to install a traffic signal at Lawrence Street and Route 9A, which will be the primary secondary route for vehicles during the reconstruction of the Ashford Avenue Bridge, currently scheduled for winter of 2010.

As always, I would like to thank the Village Board, George Calvi and the Ardsley Traffic Committee (TPCSS), and most specifically Frank Doherty, Pat Hoffman and Steve Wittenberg, for their hard work and assistance in getting the NYSDOT to pay attention.

CATV – For months we have been frustrated by the poor audio in the telecasts of the Village Board meetings. There appears to be a light at the end of the tunnel. The village has now received three revised bids from vendors who will rewire and re-equip the studio in village hall. This will not only correct the audio problem, but should areatly enhance the telecasts visually as well. Best of all, the funds for this work and equipment will come from the PEG fees supplied by Cablevision and Verizon, as negotiated in our last contract negotiation with them.

<u>Ashford Park</u> – Recently the parking lot at Ashford Park was enlarged, curbed and repaved. The extra space now allows vehicles to back out safely. The softer asphalt curbing was replaced by the stronger Belgian Block curbing making it much more apparent to a motorist if he or she accidentally jumps the curb onto the parkland. There were some complaints that one part of the parking lot was too close to the playing area, and although there was disagreement as to whether this was actually a problem (since the superior curbing is now in place), we put up a guard rail around the area of most concern. A special thank you to our Highway Department for providing the labor for the work (with no overtime incurred); they did a great job! Thanks also to Trustee Larry Nardecchia, who provided engineering services. Also note that materials and paving costs were paid out of capital accounts that were funded by developer's fees, meaning the only taxpayer cost for the job was the regular wages of the Highway Department.

Village Budget – By now those of you who do not escrow your taxes have received your 2008-09 village property tax bills. The original tax increase included in the first draft of the budget was lowered to 2.74%, the lowest in the Rivertowns and among the lowest we've aware of in Westchester County. While there was no reduction in services, this is truly a bare bones budget. With the cost of fuel and energy rising exponentially, a downturn in the overall economy plus the nondiscretionary cost of living increases in wages to union employees, we were fortunate to keep the tax increase to a minimum. This is the second year in a row with a tax levy in the 3% range. I doubt any village in the state can make a similar claim. Our thanks go out to our Village Manager, George Calvi and our Village Treasurer, Marion DeMaio, for their hard work on this year's budget.

Speed Trailer - After years of discussion, the Ardsley Police are now proud owners of a speed trailer. You may have seen this apparatus indicating your speed

while encouraging everyone to drive safely on Route 9A and Heatherdell. The trailer also accumulates data for traffic counts and speeds. We believe the machine will go a long way in helping us make our roads safer. Please note that the funds for the trailer came from a remainder capital fund account designated for police purchases, and was not paid for by the village's general fund.

Other News - Some of you may be wondering whether there will be an Ardsley Day this year. The success of this event over the past two years has been due to a small number hard working of volunteers, one of whom is me. With so many other mayoral responsibilities occurring over the past few months, I decided there wasn't enough time this year to devote to all the planning necessary for Ardsley Day. And, without me acting as resident cheerleader and taskmaster, the event wasn't meant to be for this year. If there's enough interest, perhaps we can continue sponsoring the event in 2009.

NEW STATE BUILDING CODE IN EFFECT

The Building Department wants to remind all residents that the effective date of the 2007 version Uniform of the NYS Fire Prevention and Building Code (Uniform Code) was 1/1/2008. All permits issued on or after January 1, 2008 must comply with the 2007 version of the Uniform Code regardless of when the application was originally submitted. Please plan your projects accordingly and ensure that your architect is working with the correct version of the Uniform Code as the Building Department is not permitted to deviate from this effective date.

YOUTH ADVOCATE RESTORES SAFE RIDES, SCHEDULES EVENTS

The Ardsley Youth Advocate Program is starting the Safe Rides program for the village in the fall. Safe Rides is a student/adult-run organization that provides a safe and secure way for students to get home at night on the weekends. On designated weekend evenings, from 10pm -2am, four to six students and one to two adult volunteers will staff the Safe Rides Program at the Ardsley Community Center. Two students working at the Community Center will answer all incoming telephone calls, log in calls and maintain contact via cellular phone and/or radios with each of the Safe Rides cars out on call. Two other students, preferably a male and a female, will be sent from the community center to pick up students as a team. The driver will use his or her family car and must have their senior license. The rider is responsible for keeping contact with the Community Center to give information on departure times, pick up times, addresses and passenger names. The parents will be in a separate room from students taking calls. The parents are there to handle emergency situations only.

Students participating in the Safe Rides program agree to keep all details of their service activities confidential within the program. An adult volunteer is on duty as a consultant if the young people need help. If any further assistance is desired, the team may contact the Safe Rides adult volunteers on duty, the police department, or the emergency ambulance service. All student and adult volunteers will receive training. We are looking for <u>adult</u> and <u>student</u> volunteers. STORMWATER NEWS: H₂O = \$

Yes, water conservation makes "cents" (sense)! It's expensive to chlorinate our drinkable water and treat wastewater. Here are some summer garden tips: buy hardy, native plants which require less herbicide, pesticide and water, mow lawns less frequently to develop strong roots, don't over water and try using a rain barrel to collect water for your plants. Save money and reduce polluted runoff, too.

The Stormwater Annual Report 2007-8 is now available at www.ardsleyvillage.com, Village Hall and the Library. NYSDEC has issued a new SPDES permit to the Village covering May 1, 2008 to April 30, 2010. Stormwater Management Program continues, Annual Reports in June.

Lastly, looking for a change of scene that's "fuel-friendly"? Visit the Bronx River. There's a great hiking and biking path and two Stormwater spots to visit. Park at the Crestwood RR station in Tuckahoe and walk a few yards north on the trail to the SW Management Demo garden. Also, stop by the County Center parking lot in White Plains and check out progress on conversion to a SW Management Practices Demo. Bronx River clean-up is ongoing and a healthier waterway will benefit all of us. Keep up the good work helping to make our water cleaner and have a great summer!
