THE VILLAGE NEWSLETTER

Village elections will be held on Tuesday, March 15, 1994, for the offices of Village Justice (four year term) and two Village Trustees (two year terms). To exercise your voting privilege, you must meet certain requirements and conform with specified procedures. Please make careful note of the requirements and dates listed below so that you may meet the necessary conditions and cast your ballot for the candidates of your choice.

Voter Qualifications:

1. You must be a United States citizen.

2. You must be 18 years of age or older by March 15, 1994.

3. You must have been a resident of the Village of Ardsley for the 30 days preceding the election.

Polling Locations:

1. Municipal Building - for 24th and 53rd Districts

The 24th District is represented by the whole Village area south of Ashford Avenue.

The 53rd District is represented by that area of the Village located on the north side of Ashford Avenue including all streets running north from Ashford Avenue or accessible north from Ashford Avenue up to and including the northern

end of Kensington Road and Abington Avenue to that point.

2. St. Barnabas Episcopal Church [located at intersection of Heatherdell and Revolutionary Roads] - for 25th and 54th Districts

The 54th District is represented by that area of the Village located at Abington Avenue from the north side of the northern intersection with Kensington Road to the south side of Heatherdell Road and the area south of Heatherdell Road or accessible south from Heatherdell.

The 25th District is represented by that portion of the Village north of Heatherdell Road.

To confirm your polling place and district, or should you have any questions regarding voter registration, please do not hesitate to telephone Village Clerk, Mary Kamens, at 693-1550.

VOTER REGISTRATION, MARCH 5

To vote in the Village election, you must be registered. Registration will be held on Saturday, March 5, 1994 for all four districts at Village Hall between the hours of 12 noon and 5:00 P.M.

MAIL-IN REGISTRATION

Although the official voter registration day is scheduled for March 5, please note that mail-in voter registration is available to you 365 days a year. Why experience the hassle of waiting in line or making the mad dash to Village Hall when you can relax in the comfort of your own home filling out the necessary information? Registering early by mail, gives you the assurance that your registration has been completed and no hitches will surface on Election Day. Mail-in voter registration forms can be obtained by telephoning or dropping in at the Village Clerk's office or the County Board of Elections in White Plains. Don't let a technicality prevent you from exercising your right to vote.

IMPORTANT TAX INFORMATION

THIRD PARTY NOTIFICATION: Under New York State Law, if you are 65 years of age or older or disabled and own a 1, 2, or 3 family residence, you may designate a consenting adult third party to receive duplicate copies of your tax bills and notices of unpaid taxes until further notice.

<u>AGED EXEMPTION</u>: Persons who are 65 and have owned their home for two years or more, and whose income from all sources, including social security, does not exceed \$21,300 may qualify for a tax exemption.

LIEN SALE: All 1993-94 Village taxes left unpaid will be subject to a tax lien sale held on March 21, 1994 in the office of the Village Treasurer. For information on this sale or any other tax matter, please telephone the Village Treasurer at 693-1550.

MORTGAGE SATISFACTION: If you are one of the many residents who have recently satisfied their mortgages, congratulations! You've earned it. However, although you've completed one obligation, you may now have another. YOU MUST NOTIFY THE VILLAGE THAT YOUR TAX BILLS SHOULD BE SENT TO YOUR HOME FROM THIS POINT FORWARD. Do not rely on your bank or mortgage company. Many who have, been have stuck paving interest penalties. By State Law, the Village is unable to excuse late payments for any reason. SNOW REMOVAL AD NAUSEAM

As all of you know, snow, sleet, rain, ice and record cold temperatures have made this one of the most difficult winters in many years. RECYCLING UPDATE

The 1994 Notice of Sanitation and Recycling pickup schedules were mailed to all residents and merchants last month. If you have not already-done so, please take a few minutes to review the back of the schedule which lists those items which are and are not appropriate for curbside pickup. In 1993, the Village carted 2,664.04 tons of trash to Charles Point in Peekskill versus 2,820.30 tons in 1992. This represents a reduction in the trash waste stream of 156.26 tons.


