<u>The Thelma Zimmer-William VanDorn</u> <u>Youth & Community Center</u>

The Community Center is located at 18 Center Street in Ardsley. The Community Center is used throughout the week for many Village meetings and activities. It is also available for rental on Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays. The Community Center has a fully equipped kitchen, big screen TV, conference room, restrooms and more. Fees are \$225.00 per 1/2 day and \$375.00 per full day for Village residents, and \$275.00 per 1/2 day and \$425.00 per full day for non-residents on Saturdays and Sundays. On Fridays, fees are \$125.00 for Village residents, and \$150.00 for non-residents, rental from 6 to 11 PM. There is a \$250.00 refundable security deposit. All fees for rentals and programs must be paid in advance. Call 693-8012 for more information.

Office hours are 9:00 AM-5:00 PM, Monday through Friday.

Nothing kills a good recreation program faster than late registration. There is a point when a program must be modified or cancelled due to insufficient registration. All programs require the coordination of instructors, facilities and supplies. No programs will be pro-rated.

Refund Policy

Refunds will NOT be given after a program begins unless there is a medical reason. These must be in writing and accompanied with a physician's note.

Residency

Ardsley Residents are defined as those who reside in the "Village of Ardsley" only - not the Ardsley School District.

An additional fee of \$20.00 for Recreation Programs will be charged to those outside the "Village of Ardsley."

Trip Policy

Sign up early! Trips will be cancelled without sufficient registration, and early sign-ups are key to running trips. Most trips have a minimum amount of people to be cost effective. Get your friends together and sign up now!

Payment Policy

Ardsley Parks and Recreation accepts cash and checks made out to "The Village of Ardsley." There will be a \$20.00 charge for returned checks.

Insurance

The Village of Ardsley's Parks and Recreation Department cannot and does not provide medical insurance in its program.

School Facilities

The Village of Ardsley thanks the <u>Ardsley School District</u> for generous support and the use of their gymnasiums and fields for many of our activities.

<u>Pascone Park</u> (formerly Ashford Park)

Pascone Park is located on Ashford Avenue, adjacent to the Ardsley Middle School. Amenities include 4 tennis courts, basketball court, softball field, soccer fields, skateboard park, playground area, gazebo, picnic tables, restrooms and a snack bar (in season).

McDowell Park

Home of the Ardsley Little League, McDowell Park is located on Heatherdell Road, near the Sprain Parkway. The park has 4 baseball fields, 1 tee-ball area, basketball area, pavilion, snack bar and rest rooms.

Pocket Parks

There are various "pocket" parks scattered throughout the Village: Pocost Park, Silliman Park, Firefighters Park, Legion Park, Bicentennial Park and Floyd Lichtenberg Park (at the library).
