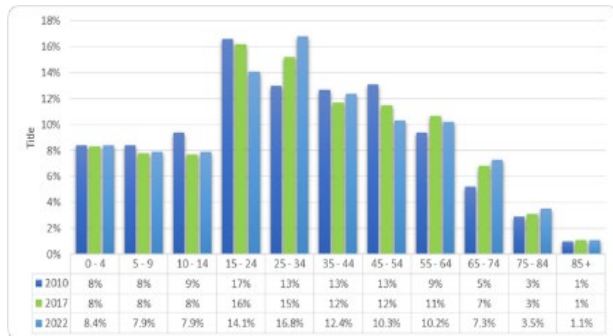

Phase C.1 | public outreach – optional statistically valid survey

Option A – Full Statistically Valid Survey

- Mailing of a paper survey to random households within the village (with Spanish translation)
- Two versions of an online survey (controlled link and open link)
- Tabulation of results and development of a written report including detailed methodology, narrative interpretation of the results with emphasis placed on graphs and charts illustrating the major findings, in addition to an executive summary highlighting the key takeaways.

Option B – Postcard Statistically Valid Survey

- Mailing of postcards to random households within the village with links (Spanish translation)
- Two versions of an online survey (controlled line and open link)



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Phase D | draft/final report

1. Prioritized inventory of improved or new facilities, programs, and/or services as identified through the Assessment process.
2. Detailed alternatives for matching identified facility, program, and service needs with existing/available resources (e.g., considering alternatives for fitting new programs into publicly owned or publicly available spaces).
3. Assessment of staffing levels required to implement inventoried needs.
4. Recommendations for implementing identified priorities in the short-term and longer-term with consideration of affordability and sustainability, including the potential use of piloting for new programs/services to gauge public use or testing use of other publicly-available facilities.

STORMWATER MANAGEMENT ANNUAL REPORT Presentation By Lorraine Kuhn
2021 Annual Stormwater Report

1. Lorraine Kuhn presented a Power Point presentation to the Board of Trustees regarding water conservation & reuse. Presentation of NYS DEC Stormwater (SW) Annual Report 2021 (SW Year March 9, 2021 to March 9, 2022). As an MS4 (Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System), the Village of Ardsley is required to prepare and submit a SW Annual Report to NYS DEC. The MS4 program covers 6 Minimum Measures (Outreach & Education, Public Participation, Illicit Discharge Detection & Elimination, Pre-construction SW Control, Post-construction SW Control, and Municipal Good Housekeeping). These measures must be addressed each year to maintain the Village of Ardsley SPDES permit (State Pollution Discharge Elimination System) which allows the Village to drain stormwater to local waterbodies.

2. APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

2.1 April 18, 2022 Board of Trustees Regular Meeting Minutes

Moved by Trustee DiJusto, Seconded by Trustee Weitz and passed unanimously. RESOLVED, that the Village Board of the Village of Ardsley hereby approves the minutes of the Regular Meeting of Monday, April 18, 2022 as submitted.

3. DEPARTMENT REPORTS

1. LEGAL

1.a May 2, 2022 Legal Report -Village Attorney Robert Ponzini
Village Attorney Ponzini stated there is nothing to report other than the matters that may have been submitted in memorandum form and he is available for Executive Session if needed.

2. MANAGER

2.a May 2, 2022 Village Manager Report
Village Manager, Joe Cerretani read the following Village Manager report:

1. RECORD'S RETENTION DAY

Friday, May 6 is Record's Retention Day in the Village. Administrative offices will be closed to the public, including the Public Library and Justice Court.

2. ADOPTED BUDGET

The 2022-2023 Adopted Budget is available on the Village website. Special thanks to Leslie Tillotson and Charles Hessler for their assistance assembling the final product.

3. NEW DPW CONSTRUCTION PROJECT

We had a great turnout at the April 19 pre-bid meeting. We have 13 General Contractors that picked up packets, and between 6-7 contractors for the trade bids (electrical, plumbing, HVAC, etc.). We are hopeful that translates to high participation submitting bids. Bids will be opened this Thursday, May 5th, and we hope to have recommendations for awards to the Board for the June 6th Regular Meeting. With that timeline, we would hope to break ground on the project by the end of July.

4. SANITARY/STORM SEWER MAPPING PROJECT

The sanitary sewer mapping is now complete. The mapping of the stormwater conveyance system is approximately 80% complete and estimated to be completed by the end of May. I have requested that the specifications be prepared for the camera work for the sanitary sewer lines; which is the next phase of the project. We hope to begin the bidding process for that project next month.

6.1 Consider a Resolution to Include Unpaid Water Rents and Penalties in the 2022-2023 Annual Tax Levy

WHEREAS, certain sewer customer accounts currently have unpaid sewer rents and penalties, and

WHEREAS, Village Law §165-22 (f) provides for the inclusion of unpaid sewer rents and penalties in the annual tax levy;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Village Board of the Village of Ardsley authorizes the Village Treasurer to include the following unpaid sewer rents and penalties on the 2022-2023 annual tax levy totaling \$50,401.36.

6.2 Consider a Resolution Authorizing the Village Manager to Execute a Memorandum of Understanding with Sustainable Westchester, Inc. for Participation in the Community Choice Aggregation Program

Moved by Trustee DiJusto, Seconded by Trustee Weitz and passed unanimously.
RESOLVED,

that the Village Board of the Village of Ardsley hereby authorizes the Village Manager to execute a Memorandum of Understanding, as well as any and all related documentation regarding participation in a Community Choice Aggregation Program that will be managed by Sustainable Westchester located at 40 Green Street, Mount Kisco, NY 10549; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the term of this understanding shall expire on the earlier of June 30, 2022 or the date on which the 2022 ESA (Electric Service Agreement) is signed by the Participating Municipality, the Program Manager, and the selected Competitive Supplier.

6.3 Consider a Resolution to Request the New York State Department of Transportation to Consider the Installation of Permanent Rumble Strips at the Southbound Exit 17 Off the Saw Mill River Parkway at Ashford Avenue

Moved by Trustee Weitz, Seconded by Trustee DiJusto and passed unanimously.
WHEREAS, Southbound Exit 17 off of the Saw Mill River Parkway at Ashford Avenue is a very short exit a sharp right hand turn; and

WHEREAS, there have been a considerable number of accidents along this exit in the past; and

WHEREAS, rumble strips are used to provide an audible and physical alert to drivers; and

WHEREAS, the New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT) installed temporary rumble strips along the exit to alert drivers to slow down while approaching the sharp right hand turn off the exit; and

WHEREAS, recognizing the audible noise that installing rumble strips will cause, this Board finds the safety of vehicle traffic outweighs any inconvenience from the noise; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Ardsley finds it to be in the best interest of the Village to request the NYSDOT consider installing permanent rumble strips along Southbound Exit 17 of the Saw Mill River Parkway.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Village Board of the Village of Ardsley requests the NYSDOT consider the installation of permanent rumble strips at Southbound Exit 17 off of the Saw Mill River Parkway, at Ashford Avenue; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Village will coordinate with the Village of Dobbs Ferry to submit this request to the NYSDOT.

WHEREAS, the Town of Greenburgh has defended these claims, having assumed the assessment function of the Village of Ardsley and will settle on behalf of the Town, and

WHEREAS, the Ardsley School District as intervenor will approve settlement on similar terms, and

WHEREAS, after consultation with the Village Attorney, the Town attorney and Special Counsel for the Ardsley School District, and in light of the recommended settlement by the Town and School District, the Village of Ardsley now believes that a settlement has been achieved which represents the best interests of the Village and its residents and resolves this lawsuit without the risk and cost of further litigation,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Village Attorney is authorized to execute a Consent Judgment settling that property's Assessment years as follows:

Delta Variant: What We Know About the Science

On July 27, 2021, CDC released updated guidance on the need for urgently increasing COVID-19 vaccination coverage and a recommendation for everyone in areas of substantial or high transmission to wear a mask in public indoor places, even if they are fully vaccinated. CDC issued this new guidance due to several concerning developments and newly emerging data signals.

First, a significant increase in new cases reversed what had been a steady decline since January 2021. In the days leading up to our guidance update, CDC saw a rapid and alarming rise in the COVID-19 case and hospitalization rates around the country.

- In late June, the 7-day moving average of reported cases was around 12,000. On July 27, the 7-day moving average of cases reached over 60,000. This case rate looked more like the rate of cases we had seen before the vaccine was widely available.

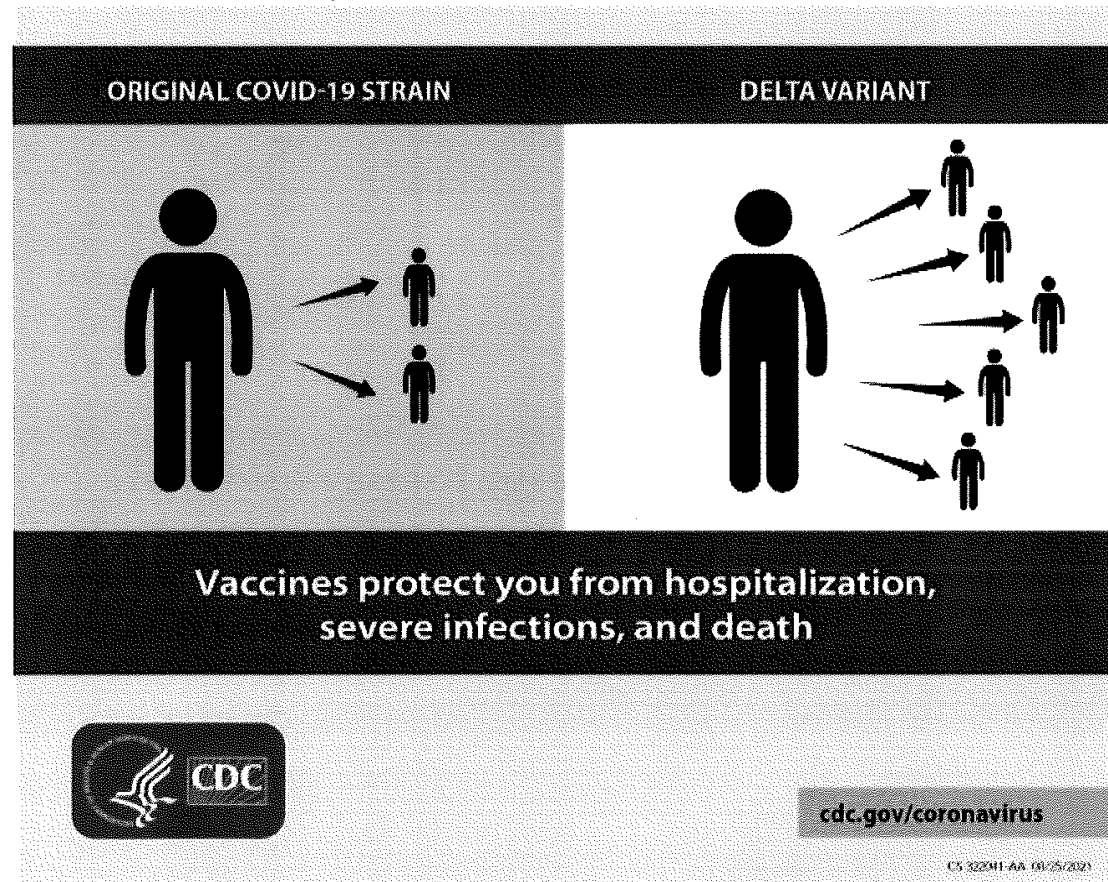
Second, new data began to emerge that the Delta variant was more infectious and was leading to increased transmissibility when compared with other variants, even in some vaccinated individuals. This includes recently published data from CDC and our public health partners, unpublished surveillance data that will be publicly available in the coming weeks, information included in CDC's updated Science Brief on COVID-19 Vaccines and Vaccination, and ongoing outbreak investigations linked to the Delta variant.

Delta is currently the predominant variant of the virus in the United States. Below is a high-level summary of what CDC scientists have recently learned about the Delta variant. More information will be made available when more data are published or released in other formats.

Infections and Spread

The Delta variant causes more infections and spreads faster than early forms of SARS-CoV-2, the virus that causes COVID-19

The Delta variant spreads more easily than previous variants—it may cause more than 2x as many infections

- **The Delta variant is more contagious:** The Delta variant is highly contagious, more than 2x as contagious as previous variants.
- **Some data suggest the Delta variant might cause more severe illness than previous variants in unvaccinated people.** In two different studies from Canada and Scotland, patients infected with the Delta variant were more likely to be hospitalized than patients infected with Alpha or the original virus that causes COVID-19. Even so, the vast majority of hospitalization and death caused by COVID-19 are in unvaccinated people.

- **Unvaccinated people remain the greatest concern:** The greatest risk of transmission is among unvaccinated people who are much more likely to get infected, and therefore transmit the virus. Fully vaccinated people get COVID-19 (known as breakthrough infections) less often than unvaccinated people. People infected with the Delta variant, including fully vaccinated people with symptomatic breakthrough infections, can transmit the virus to others. CDC is continuing to assess data on whether fully vaccinated people with asymptomatic breakthrough infections can transmit the virus.
- **Fully vaccinated people with Delta variant breakthrough infections can spread the virus to others. However, vaccinated people appear to spread the virus for a shorter time:** For prior variants, lower amounts of viral genetic material were found in samples taken from fully vaccinated people who had breakthrough infections than from unvaccinated people with COVID-19. For people infected with the Delta variant, similar amounts of viral genetic material have been found among both unvaccinated and fully vaccinated people. However, like prior variants, the amount of viral genetic material may go down faster in fully vaccinated people when compared to unvaccinated people. This means fully vaccinated people will likely spread the virus for less time than unvaccinated people.

Vaccines

Vaccines in the US are highly effective, including against the Delta variant

- The COVID-19 vaccines approved or authorized in the United States are highly effective at preventing severe disease and death, including against the Delta variant. But they are not 100% effective, and some fully vaccinated people will become infected (called a breakthrough infection) and experience illness. For all people, the vaccine provides the best protection against serious illness and death.
- Vaccines are playing a crucial role in limiting spread of the virus and minimizing severe disease. Although vaccines are highly effective, they are not perfect, and there will be vaccine breakthrough infections. Millions of Americans are vaccinated, and that number is growing. This means that even though the risk of breakthrough infections is low, there will be thousands of fully vaccinated people who become infected and able to infect others, especially with the surging spread of the Delta variant. Low vaccination coverage in many communities is driving the current rapid surge in cases involving the Delta variant, which also increases the chances that even more concerning variants could emerge.
- Vaccination is the best way to protect yourself, your family, and your community. High vaccination coverage will reduce spread of the virus and help prevent new variants from emerging. CDC recommends that everyone aged 12 years and older get vaccinated as soon as possible.

Masks

Given what we know about the Delta variant, vaccine effectiveness, and current vaccine coverage, layered prevention strategies, including wearing masks, are needed to reduce the transmission of this variant

- At this time, as we build the level of vaccination nationwide, we must also use all the prevention strategies available, including masking indoors in public places, to stop transmission and stop the pandemic. Everyone who is able, including fully vaccinated people, should wear masks in public indoor places in areas of substantial or high transmission.

Emergence of Omicron

On November 24, 2021, a new variant of SARS-CoV-2, B.1.1.529, was reported to the World Health Organization (WHO). This new variant was first detected in specimens collected on November 11, 2021 in Botswana and on November 14, 2021 in South Africa.

On November 26, 2021, WHO named the B.1.1.529 Omicron and classified it as a Variant of Concern (VOC). On November 30, 2021, the United States designated Omicron as a Variant of Concern, and on December 1, 2021 the first confirmed U.S. case of Omicron was identified.

CDC has been collaborating with global public health and industry partners to learn about Omicron, as we continue to monitor its course. CDC has been using genomic surveillance throughout the course of the pandemic to track variants of SARS-CoV-2, the virus that causes COVID-19, and inform public health practice. We don't yet know how easily it spreads, the severity of illness it causes, or how well available vaccines and medications work against it.

Despite the increased attention of Omicron, Delta continues to be the main variant circulating in the United States.

What We Know about Omicron

Infection and Spread

- **How easily does Omicron spread?** The Omicron variant likely will spread more easily than the original SARS-CoV-2 virus and how easily Omicron spreads compared to Delta remains unknown. CDC expects that anyone with Omicron infection can spread the virus to others, even if they are vaccinated or don't have symptoms.
- **Will Omicron cause more severe illness?** More data are needed to know if Omicron infections, and especially reinfections and breakthrough infections in people who are fully vaccinated, cause more severe illness or death than infection with other variants.
- **Will vaccines work against Omicron?** Current vaccines are expected to protect against severe illness, hospitalizations, and deaths due to infection with the Omicron variant. However, breakthrough infections in people who are fully vaccinated are likely to occur. With other variants, like Delta, vaccines have remained effective at preventing severe illness, hospitalizations, and death. The recent emergence of Omicron further emphasizes the importance of vaccination and boosters.
- **Will treatments work against Omicron?** Scientists are working to determine how well existing treatments for COVID-19 work. Based on the changed genetic make-up of Omicron, some treatments are likely to remain effective while others may be less effective.

We have the Tools to Fight Omicron

Vaccines remain the best public health measure to protect people from COVID-19, slow transmission, and reduce the likelihood of new variants emerging. COVID-19 vaccines are highly effective at preventing severe illness, hospitalizations, and death. Scientists are currently investigating Omicron, including how protected fully vaccinated people will be against infection, hospitalization, and death. CDC recommends that everyone 5 years and older protect themselves from COVID-19 by getting fully vaccinated. CDC recommends that everyone ages 18 years and older should get a booster shot at least two months after their initial J&J/Janssen vaccine or six months after completing their primary COVID-19 vaccination series of Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna.

Masks offer protection against all variants. CDC continues to recommend wearing a mask in public indoor settings in areas of substantial or high community transmission, regardless of vaccination status. CDC provides advice about masks for people who want to learn more about what type of mask is right for them depending on their circumstances.

Tests can tell you if you are currently infected with COVID-19. Two types of tests are used to test for current infection: nucleic acid amplification tests (NAATs) and antigen tests. NAAT and antigen tests can only tell you if you have a current infection. Individuals can use the COVID-19 Viral Testing Tool to help determine what kind of test to seek. Additional tests would be needed to determine if your infection was caused by Omicron. Visit your state, tribal,

local, or [territorial](#) health department's website to look for the latest local information on testing.

[Self-tests](#) can be used at home or anywhere, are easy to use, and produce rapid results. If your self-test has a positive result, stay home or isolate for 10 days, wear a mask if you have contact with others, and call your healthcare provider. If you have any questions about your self-test result, call your healthcare provider or public health department.

Until we know more about the risk of Omicron, it is important to use **all tools available** to [protect yourself and others](#).

What CDC is Doing to Learn about Omicron

Virus Characteristics

CDC scientists are working with partners to gather data and virus samples that can be studied to answer important questions about the Omicron variant. Scientific experiments have already started. CDC will provide updates as soon as possible.

Variant Surveillance

In the United States, CDC uses [genomic surveillance](#) to track variants of SARS-CoV-2, the virus that causes COVID-19 to more quickly identify and act upon these findings to best protect the public's health. CDC established multiple ways to connect and share genomic sequence data being produced by CDC, public health laboratories, and commercial diagnostic laboratories within publicly accessible databases maintained by the [National Center for Biotechnology Information](#)[external icon](#) (NCBI) and the [Global Initiative on Sharing Avian Influenza Data](#)[external icon](#) (GISAID). CDC's national genomic surveillance can detect a variant that is circulating at 0.1% frequency with 99% statistical confidence.

What to do if you test positive for COVID-19

If you test positive for COVID-19 and have one or more health conditions that increase your risk of becoming very sick, treatment may be available. Contact a health professional right away after a positive test to determine if you may be eligible, even if your symptoms are mild right now. Don't delay: Treatment must be started within the first few days to be effective. If you have a fever, cough, or other symptoms, you might have COVID-19. Most people have mild illness and are able to recover at home. If you are sick:

- Keep track of your symptoms.
- **If you have an emergency warning sign (including trouble breathing)**, call 911.

Steps to help prevent the spread of COVID-19 if you are sick

If you are sick with COVID-19 or think you might have COVID-19, follow the steps below to care for yourself and to help protect other people in your home and community.

Stay home except to get medical care

- **Stay home.** Most people with COVID-19 have mild illness and can recover at home without medical care. Do not leave your home, except to get medical care. Do not visit public areas and do not go to places where you are unable to wear a mask.
- **Take care of yourself.** Get rest and stay hydrated. Take over-the-counter medicines, such as acetaminophen, to help you feel better.
- **Stay in touch with your doctor.** Call before you get medical care. Be sure to get care if you have trouble breathing, or have any other emergency warning signs, or if you think it is an emergency.
- **Avoid public transportation**, ride-sharing, or taxis if possible.

Get tested

- If you have symptoms of COVID-19, get tested. While waiting for test results, stay away from others, including staying apart from those living in your household.
- **Get tested as soon as possible after your symptoms start.** Treatments may be available for people with COVID-19 who are at risk for becoming very sick. Don't delay: Treatment must be started early to be effective—some treatments must begin within 5 days of your first symptoms.

- Supply of treatments may be limited, and treatments are reserved for those at high risk for becoming very sick. Contact your healthcare provider right away if your test result is positive to determine if you may be eligible.

- Self-tests are one of several options for testing for the virus that causes COVID-19 and may be more convenient than laboratory-based tests and point-of-care tests. Ask your healthcare provider or your local health department if you need help interpreting your test results.

- You can visit your state, tribal, localexternal icon, and territorial health department's website to look for the latest local information on testing sites.

Separate yourself from other people

As much as possible, stay in a specific room and away from other people and pets in your home. If possible, you should use a separate bathroom. If you need to be around other people or animals in or outside of the home, wear a well-fitting mask.

Tell your close contacts that they may have been exposed to COVID-19. An infected person can spread COVID-19 starting 48 hours (or 2 days) before the person has any symptoms or tests positive. By letting your close contacts know they may have been exposed to COVID-19, you are helping to protect everyone.

- See COVID-19 and Animals if you have questions about pets.
- If you are diagnosed with COVID-19, someone from the health department may call you. Answer the call to slow the spread.

Monitor your symptoms

- **Symptoms of COVID-19 include fever, cough, or other symptoms.**
- **Follow care instructions from your healthcare provider and local health department.** Your local health authorities may give instructions on checking your symptoms and reporting information.

When to seek emergency medical attention

Look for **emergency warning signs*** for COVID-19. If someone is showing any of these signs, **seek emergency medical care immediately:**

- Trouble breathing
- Persistent pain or pressure in the chest
- New confusion
- Inability to wake or stay awake

- Pale, gray, or blue-colored skin, lips, or nail beds, depending on skin tone
- *This list is not all possible symptoms. Please call your medical provider for any other symptoms that are severe or concerning to you.

Call 911 or call ahead to your local emergency facility: Notify the operator that you are seeking care for someone who has or may have COVID-19.

Call ahead before visiting your doctor

- **Call ahead.** Many medical visits for routine care are being postponed or done by phone or telemedicine.

- **If you have a medical appointment that cannot be postponed, call your doctor's office,** and tell them you have or may have COVID-19. This will help the office protect themselves and other patients.

If you are sick, wear a well-fitting mask

- **You should wear a mask** if you must be around other people or animals, including pets (even at home).

- Wear a mask with the best fit, protection, and comfort for you.

- You don't need to wear the mask if you are alone. If you can't put on a mask (because of trouble breathing, for example), cover your coughs and sneezes in some other way. Try to stay at least 6 feet away from other people. This will help protect the people around you.

- Masks should not be placed on young children under age 2 years, anyone who has trouble breathing, or anyone who is not able to remove the mask without help.

Cover your coughs and sneezes

- **Cover your mouth and nose** with a tissue when you cough or sneeze.

- **Throw away used tissues** in a lined trash can.

- **Immediately wash your hands** with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. If soap and water are not available, clean your hands with an alcohol-based hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol.

Clean your hands often

- **Wash your hands** often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. This is especially important after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing; going to the bathroom; and before eating or preparing food.

- **Use hand sanitizer** if soap and water are not available. Use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol, covering all surfaces of your hands and rubbing them together until they feel dry.
- **Soap and water** are the best option, especially if hands are visibly dirty.
- **Avoid touching** your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Handwashing Tips

Avoid sharing personal household items
- **Do not share** dishes, drinking glasses, cups, eating utensils, towels, or bedding with other people in your home.
- **Wash these items thoroughly after using them** with soap and water or put in the dishwasher.

Clean surfaces in your home regularly
- **Clean and disinfect** high-touch surfaces (for example, doorknobs, tables, handles, light switches, and countertops) in your “sick room” and bathroom. In shared spaces, you should clean and disinfect surfaces and items after each use by the person who is ill.
- **If you are sick and cannot clean**, a caregiver or other person should only clean and disinfect the area around you (such as your bedroom and bathroom) on an as needed basis. Your caregiver/other person should wait as long as possible (at least several hours) and wear a mask before entering, cleaning, and disinfecting shared spaces that you use.
- **Clean and disinfect areas that may have blood, stool, or body fluids on them.**
- **Use household cleaners and disinfectants.** Clean visible dirty surfaces with household cleaners containing soap or detergent. Then, use a household disinfectant.

 - Be sure to follow the instructions on the label to ensure safe and effective use of the product. Many products recommend keeping the surface wet with a disinfectant for a certain period of time (look at “contact time” on the product label).
 - You may also need to wear personal protective equipment, such as gloves, depending on the directions on the product label.
 - Immediately after disinfecting, wash your hands with soap and water for 20 seconds.

**RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE THE VILLAGE MANAGER TO SIGN AN
AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE VILLAGE OF ARDSLEY AND STUDENT
ASSISTANCE SERVICES FOR PART-TIME YOUTH ADVOCATE**

RESOLVED, that the Village Board of the Village of Ardsley hereby authorizes the Village Manager to sign an agreement with Student Assistance Services Corporation to provide a part-time Youth Advocate to work within the Village for 7.0 hours per week from June 1, 2022 through May 31, 2023.

Agreement

Agreement made this ___ day of _____ 2022 by and between **STUDENT ASSISTANCE SERVICES CORPORATION**, 660 White Plains Road, Tarrytown, New York 10591, hereinafter referred to as the “**CONTRACTOR**”, and the **VILLAGE OF ARDSLEY**, hereinafter referred to as the “**VILLAGE**”.

WHEREAS, the **VILLAGE** desires to obtain the assistance of a community-based organization to help prevent and reduce substance use among middle school and high school students; and

WHEREAS, the **CONTRACTOR** desires to provide such services for the compensation and on the terms herein provided.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby agreed as follows:

I. Services Provided by the CONTRACTOR

1. The **CONTRACTOR** shall provide a community-wide prevention program.
 - a. The **CONTRACTOR** shall provide a part-time Youth Advocate to work within the **VILLAGE** for 364 hours from June 1, 2022 through May 31, 2023.
 - b. The **CONTRACTOR** will assist the **VILLAGE** with the following:
 - i. The Youth Advocate (AYA) will plan, provide and promote drug-free, positive alternative activities, such as “Middle School Hangout”, Red Cross Babysitting courses, and other drug free alternative activities;
 - ii. The AYA will coordinate and supervise a “Homework Helper” program to assist and guide middle school students with their homework assignments and;
 - iii. The AYA will meet with Ardsley High School students as part of a peer leadership program to prepare them to function as mentors at AYA activities such as Homework Helper and Middle School Hangout;
 - iv. The AYA will collaborate with the Ardsley Middle School and High School staff and administration in order to promote and recruit for the AYA programs;
 - v. The AYA will provide monthly substance use prevention awareness information through a variety of platforms such as social media; Village publications and platforms such as the Village Facebook page;
 - vi. The AYA will regularly attend and participate in Ardsley SAYF Coalitions meetings and sponsored events, and chair monthly Youth Advocate meetings to gain feedback and to keep members informed of activities.

2. The Executive Director of the **CONTRACTOR** together with the **VILLAGE** shall plan a process of supervision for the counselor.
3. The **CONTRACTOR** shall maintain the following insurance coverage in conjunction with the services to be performed hereunder and shall make available for inspection by the **VILLAGE**, appropriately endorsed certificates of insurance, evidencing the following:
 - a. Worker's Compensation Insurance covering all staff members of the **CONTRACTOR**.
 - b. General liability insurance with limits of not less than \$2,000,000 combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage liability.
 - c. Professional liability with limits of not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$3,000,000 aggregate.

II. Payment

In return for the services provided by the **CONTRACTOR**, the **VILLAGE** agrees to pay the **CONTRACTOR** a total amount not to exceed FIFTEEN THOUSAND SIX HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-SIX DOLLARS (\$15,676.00). Payment to the **CONTRACTOR** shall be made in four payments. The **CONTRACTOR** will invoice the **VILLAGE** on July 1, 2022 (\$3,919.00), October 1, 2022 (\$3,919.00), January 2, 2023 (\$3,919.00) and May 1, 2023 (\$3,919.00). The **VILLAGE** will remit payment within 30 days after the receipt of invoice.

Additional hours for counseling services will be provided at a rate of \$26.50 per hour. The **VILLAGE** may request up to five hours per week, to a maximum of 260 hours over 12 months.

In the event the counselor position fails to be filled under the terms of the agreement, appropriate modifications shall be made to this payment schedule.

The **VILLAGE** recognizes the payments made to the **CONTRACTOR** for the services described in this agreement represent a share of the full cost of the services provided, with the remainder of costs incurred by the **CONTRACTOR** to be reimbursed through a grant from the New York State Office of Addiction Services and Support (**NYS OASAS**). The **VILLAGE** acknowledges the obligation of the **CONTRACTOR** to provide services under this agreement are contingent upon and limited by the funds received by the **CONTRACTOR** from **NYS OASAS** for the purposes stated herein. The **VILLAGE** acknowledges the **NYS OASAS** monies received by the **CONTRACTOR** are on a net-deficit funding basis.

III. Non-Assignability

This Agreement shall not be assigned without the expressed written consent of the Village of Ardsley.

IV. **Term**

This Agreement shall be effective for the period June 1, 2022 through May 31, 2023.

V. **Compliance**

The **CONTRACTOR** shall remain responsible for ensuring that any service provided pursuant to this contract complies with all pertinent provisions of Federal, State and Local statutes, rules and regulations.

VI. It is understood and agreed that this Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties, for the services described herein. It is understood by the parties that any changes of the foregoing provisions, must be in writing and signed by each of the parties hereto.
