Resolution authorizing the items listed below pursuant to the Bond Acts enacted in 1965, 1972 and 1996 and the Environmental Protection Fund, as well as federal grant awards available for such projects.

herein called the "Municipality", after thorough consideration of the various aspects of the problem and study of available data, has hereby determined that certain work, as described in the Project Work Plan prepared by Westchester County and submitted to the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation, is desirable, is in the public interest, and is required in order to implement a public education and outreach program; and

WHEREAS, the Environmental Conservation Law ("ECL") authorizes State assistance to municipalities for water quality improvement projects by means of a contract, and the Municipality deems it to be in the public interest and benefit under this law to be a municipal partner to the County's contract with the State for the Project;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY Village of Ardsley Board of Trustees
(Governing Body of Municipality)

1. That George F. Calvi, Village Manager
(Name and Title of Designated Authorized Representative)

or such person's successor in office, is the representative authorized to act in behalf of the Municipality's governing body in all matters related to State assistance under ECL Articles 17, 51 and 56 and/or any applicable federal grant provisions. The representative is also authorized to enter into an intermunicipal agreement with Westchester County to work with and through the County of Westchester as the lead party to make application, execute the State Assistance Contract, submit Project documentation, and otherwise act for the Municipality's governing body in all matters related to the Project and to State assistance; and

2. That the Municipality agrees that it will fund its portion of the cost of the Project through eligible in-kind services and that resources will be available to meet the Municipal Partner commitment by the contract end date (March 1st, 2009); and
3. That one (1) certified copy of this Resolution be prepared and sent to the Westchester County Department of Planning; and
4. That this Resolution take effect immediately.

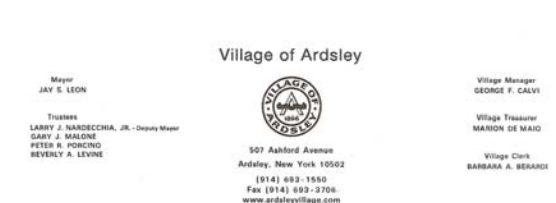
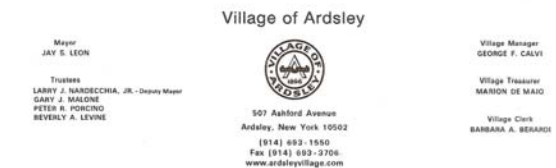
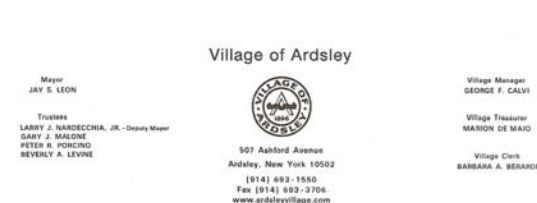

Volunteers clean up what others cast off

A four-acre meadow and bog, a river, a red sun, and a bright blue sky to create a small but beautiful scene along the banks of the Saw Mill River last Sunday.

All were found off the Lawrence Street exit of the Saw Mill River Parkway in Ardsley during a special Earth Day cleanup. The event was organized by the Saw Mill River Coalition, a 24-year-old nonprofit based in Yorktown that is working to improve and protect the river's habitat.

"I just think that everybody has thrown it as their backyard trash heap," said Ann-Marie Mitroff, the Coalition's coordinator and a Dobbs Ferry resident, as she handed out

free hand bags, orange vests, and assorted tools to the 40-odd volunteers who turned out to gather litter and other debris along the Saw Mill.

Among the volunteers was another "The Masters School" in Dobbs Ferry and members of the Hudson River and Beyond, Canoeing and Kayaking Club, a group headed by Dobbs Ferry resident Viki Scott and organized through the website Meetup.com. Also on hand, and a first with the Coalition, were employees of the Albany-based The Company, which offered its services free of charge to help the Coalition remove the invasive plants that choke many of the river along the Saw Mill. Almost 100 regional offices in the home.

In all, the cleanup, which started

at 9:00 a.m. and continued through the middle of the afternoon, sorted about 120 bags of trash, including about 20 bags worth that members of the Kayaking and Canoeing Club collected from the river. On land, the trash was picked up along the South County Parkway, Lancaster Street, and Saw Mill River Road.

Most of the trash was plastic bottles, also known as "beachables," which tend to wash up areas where the river is blocked by rocks or larger debris. The problem cleared an especially large hoardage from the river south of Lawrence Street.

"Most people don't think that just throwing a bottle is illegal dumping,"

but it is," Mitroff said. "Somehow this sort of litter is an OK part of society."

The dumping problem was evident when the Nor'easter on April 15-16 caused the river, and its unnatural contents, to overflow its banks. The flood damaged businesses and homes on both sides of the Saw Mill and closed the parkway for two days.

"I think they were shocked by how much litter there was," said Mary Schellhorn about the students from Masters, where she works as a senior class adviser and director of communications. Schellhorn, who is also a Dobbs Ferry resident, said she personally was "horrified" by what was found.

Though the cleanup was organized prior to the Nor'easter, Mitroff was not surprised by what the flood brought to the surface.

"I knew what I was going to see," she said. "I knew was going to see a lot of stuff that I didn't want in the river."

In response to what was found, the Coalition is planning to hold more frequent cleanups in the future. It is also going to continue the vine-cutting project organized by its Restoration Action Team, known as the River RATs. The next Free-A-Tree event will be Saturday, May 5, at 9:30 p.m., off the Farragut Avenue exit of the northbound Saw Mill River Parkway.

Items which can be dropped off include (but are not limited to) photo & pool chemicals; automotive fluids; pesticides; insecticides, flammable liquids; polishes and waxes; cell phones; mercury thermometers; computers & monitors; automobile tires (10 limit); fire extinguishers; small propane tanks, etc. Do not bring oil and latex paint, motor oil, vehicle batteries, smoke & fire detectors, fireworks, ammunition, pharmaceutical or medical waste. STORMWATER PHASE II PROGRAM PROGRESSES BY LEAPS & BOUNDS

Volunteer Stormwater Maven Lorraine Kuhn asks "Is your backyard stream clean?" The answer may be "yes." Dr. Kuhn and student intern Brian Japinga have tested six sites around the entire perimeter of the Village. There's a fair amount of trash and debris, but the water itself is mostly clear and odor free, pH 7 and testing negative for common pollutants. That's good news for the Sprain Brook and Saw Mill River, our receiving water bodies. Testing will continue until we've checked all 57 of Ardsley's outfalls, then the cycle will begin again as a permanent program.

Part of our Phase II SW Program has involved bringing GIS (geographic information systems) to Ardsley. Presently, we are working with Westchester County IT and the Greenburgh Assessor's Office to upgrade and link our system. Please contact Barbara Berardi, Village Clerk, or Planning Secretary Lois Duggan at 693-1550 to find out more about these new services. NO SNOW IN THE ROW!

That's right! Please keep your shoveled snow out of the Right-of-Way, the street that runs past your property. Snow is still "storm water", albeit frozen water. Shoveling it on to grassy vegetated areas gives it a chance to melt back into the ground instead of washing into the storm drain system. Also, pushing your snow back into the street creates a traffic hazard, especially when it freezes up again.

Another winter storm water tip is to try to use a minimum of salt and deicer. Salt is a major pollutant in our runoff. Please try to break up icy patches instead. Better yet, fix those leaky gutters and direct downspouts away from paved surfaces and walkways so you can prevent slippery patches from forming.

Integrated Pest Management (IPM)

IPM is a process for managing, preventing and suppressing pests with minimal impact on human health, the environment and non-target organisms. IPM incorporates all reasonable measures by properly identifying, monitoring and controlling pests through the use of cultural, physical, biological and chemical control methods to reduce pests to acceptable levels. Pesticides are only used as a last resort, and if pesticides are needed, the least toxic pest-specific alternative is always selected. It is rare that we have to use a pesticide. There were no pesticides used in any of our buildings last year.

Pesticide Neighbor Notification Law

The Pesticide Neighbor Notification Law, Section 409-h of the Education Law requires schools to provide a written notice to all parents, guardians and staff at the beginning of each school year that includes the following points:

- pesticide products may be used periodically throughout the school year
- schools are required to maintain a list of parents, guardians and staff who wish to receive 48-hour written advanced notice of an actual pesticide application
- the name of the school representative to contact for further information

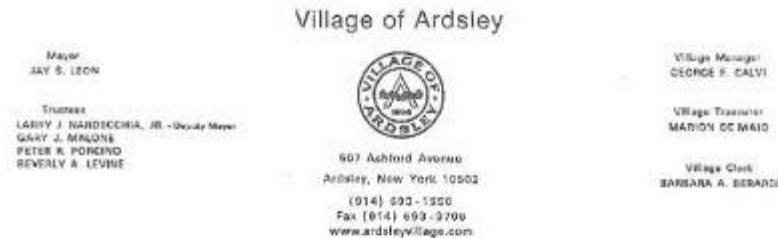

Porcino: RESOLVED: that the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village of Ardsley, New York authorize George Calvi, Village Manager to submit and application as applicant to the New York State Department of State for a grant under the Shared Municipal Services Incentive (SMSI) Grant Program for the 2007-08 Program Year. The grant application will be submitted under Category 2: Shared Highway Services Incentive Awards for a project titled "Construction of a Salt Shed."
