Biodegradable biobaggies for pet waste, which were provided by MM1/MM2 Westchester County grant, continued to be available at Village Hall and the Library. They were also distributed at Ardsley Day.

All maintenance is done indoors, any and all spills cleaned with absorbent, thus oil and grease are below benchmark cut-off concentrations. Salt is stored in a salt shed. Outfalls are monitored as part of Ardsley MS4 program.
