It was recorded for re-broadcast on Cable Access TV, Optimum Channel 75 and Verizon Channels 32 and 35.

Eighteen people attended the meeting in person including Mayor Kaboolian, Trustees DiJusto, Edelstein, Weitz and Bencosme, Village Manager Cerretani, Village Attorney Ponzini, Village Clerk Rocco, CATV Director Malone, Former Mayor Leon and CAC Chair Kapsis. In addition, eleven people attended via Zoom.

Mayor Kaboolian commented that the Village should expand Food Scrap Collection efforts and asked if it was necessary to separate "Brown" and "Green" items for collection. Kuhn answered that separation of "Brown" and "Green" items depicted in the Presentation was done at the Westchester County Compost site in Valhalla for demonstration purposes, and was not required for bringing in scraps for collection. However, Kuhn stressed that scraps must not be contaminated with metals and plastics. Noting the recent heavy storm, Mayor Kaboolian hoped that the County could do more with controlling flooding at Macy Park. Kuhn responded that Macy Park must still act as a storage area during big storms and this spares the Village from flooding the downtown business district. Moreover, while still getting flooded, the new playground and field installations at Macy Park are now more resilient and function is recovered as soon as floodwaters recede. Trustee Bencosme had a question about Green Infrastructure and native plantings for use in flood control. Kuhn answered that the most recent heavy storm overwhelmed stormwater practices. However, Kuhn added that the Village does have directives in place for use of native non-invasive species, and that the Planning Board stipulates use of native non-invasive in reviews of all projects. Ardsley DPW adheres to use of native non-invasives, as aided by advice from Trustee Edelstein.

There were no changes to the Stormwater Management Plan required following the Village Board meeting.
