MANAGER'S REPORT 2/16/2021

1. Con Ed Work on American Legion -

So, after many, many months/years of trying to get through to people at Con Ed to finish the work they told us they would do about 4 years ago, they are finally working on the upgrades to provide for redundancy for the Community Center, Library and ASVAC buildings in the case of a large scale outage. This will allow for easier restoration. That is the work going on right now on American Legion. I have asked for a timeline, but don't have that yet. But at least it's finally getting done!

2. Sewer Rents –

Apparently there are questions that some folks have regarding the sewer rent bills that went out for the second quarter. I encourage anyone with questions to start with the information that is on our website at <https://www.ardsleyvillage.com/public-works/pages/sanitary-sewer-information> and if they require additional information, they should feel free to contact Village Hall at 693-1550. These bills will be going out quarterly and are funding all of our sanitary sewer costs. Sanitary sewer costs are no longer paid for through the General Fund via taxes. Town of Greenburgh Supervisor Paul Feiner previously put out a message that bills did not need to be paid, however, that was for Town residents only, not Village residents. The Town and the Village are working together to ensure that our respective residents are paying only to one entity for sanitary sewer services and we expect resolution on this issue within the next couple of months. Sanitary sewer bills for Village residents must be paid on time in order to avoid accumulating penalties and re-levy on Village taxes.

March 1, 2021 Village Manager Report

Village Manager Robson read the following report:

March 15, 2021 Village Manager Report

Village Manager Robson read the following report:

- The Budget process is well underway and it is a significant challenge this year. The tentative budget will be out on March 19th.
- We will be working with other Municipalities on getting our joint road improvement projects together. The Board will ultimately make the decision about which roads will be completed after reviewing the costs.

April 5, 2021 Manager Report-Village Manager, Meredith Robson read the following report:

1. **ROAD IMPROVEMENTS**- I am happy to report that we are expecting the full road repaving of Ashford Ave to begin by the end of the month. We are working with the contractor to get this scheduled as soon as possible. Once we have a final schedule for this work and for the other planned road improvements, we will provide notice to the public.
2. **MOODYS**— I am very pleased and proud to announce that the Village has just received news from Moody's of another upgrade to our bond rating! We have been upgraded from Aa2 to Aa1, which is just below the top AAA rating. This upgrade is the 3rd upgrade in 3 years that the Village has received and may likely be the highest possible rating given our size and total tax base. It places the Village in the top 10% of all New York municipalities rated by Moody's. This upgrade, as well as the previous upgrades, are proof that the Village's fiscal practices are strong and respected by Moody's and a higher rating leads to potentially greater attention on bids when we go out to the marketplace for funding and lower interest rates on our borrowings.
3. **HIGHWAY GARAGE**- We are working with the contractor and expect the existing house on our new highway garage property to be demolished by the end of the month to make room for our new highway garage!

Manager Robson provided the Board with an overview of the 2021-2022 Tentative Budget:

- Total general fund appropriations are \$594,867 or 4.25% more than the 2020-2021 budget.
- Total general fund revenues are slightly below the current budget figure.
- Police retirement costs have increased by \$275, 874 and other employee retirement costs have increased by \$47,129 for a total pension cost increase of \$323,003.
- Changes in personnel include adjustments to hours of existing staff, salary adjustments and additional staff.
- Reduced the tax certiorari budget by \$50,000.
- Health insurance costs increased by \$32,500.
- Operating budget includes funding for capital items in the amount of \$324, 901

April 19, 2021 Manager Report:

1. ROAD IMPROVEMENTS- We have begun the work of paving Ashford Ave, Exeter and the Pascone Park parking lot. This work is expected to be completed by the end of the week. We are also in the process of bidding out our curbing work for this year and those bids are due to the Village by May 6th. Lastly, we are working on the bid specs for the actual milling and paving work to be done this year and that bid is joint with the other villages in the Town of Greenburgh. Once we have a final schedule for the curbing work and for the other planned road improvements, we will provide notice to the public. For a list of all roads to be completed, please visit our website at https://www.ardsleyvillage.com/sites/g/files/vyhlif4126/f/news/tentative_budget_3_19_21_final_version.pdf. The full capital plan begins on page 142 and lists all the roads to be completed under the 2021-22 budget year. There is a great deal of work to be done and we appreciate your patience as we make these Village improvements.

2. TOWN OF GREENBURGH REASSESSMENT- The Town of Greenburgh is undergoing a complete reassessment of properties, similar to the work done in 2016. Property owners should have received notice of this and their preliminary new assessments. Village Manager Report May 17, 2021

Village Manager, Meredith Robson read the following report:

Please bear in mind that no Village official is empowered to waive the late fee for any reason.
3. **ROAD IMPROVEMENTS:** Pending contract approval by the Board of Trustees, our road improvements for this summer will begin soon. The curbing work will begin first and then the paving will begin late Summer/early Fall. The Village has an extensive list of roads being improved this year and this work is done as part of a joint contract with the other Rivertowns. If the work is not completed by the end of the paving season, it will be done next Spring. Once we get a schedule from the contractor, we will blast out the information.

MANAGER'S REPORT 6/7/21

- 1. ROAD IMPROVEMENTS:** The bid received for the curbing portion of the work was previously awarded and we expect that work to begin next week. We will be getting notice out to the community ASAP. The bid for the paving portion is on tonight's agenda. We are doing a significant amount of work this year. The curbing work will be done first and the paving will not likely start until the Fall. We are expecting an agreement with Con Ed by the next meeting which will be a joint agreement like we did for Ashford Ave. which will identify the portion of the work on the roads we're doing this year for which Con Ed will reimburse us. The reimbursement is based on what their obligation would be to pave the disturbed portion of the roads they work on, but we are doing the entire road so they are reimbursing us for their piece on each of the impacted roads.
- 2. HEATHERDELL ROAD SIDEWALK/GUIDERAIL PROJECT:** We were just notified today that the contractor for this project will begin work tomorrow, June 8th. This work is expected to last through early August.
- 3. TAXES DUE:** The 1st half of the 2021 Village Tax is due, without penalty, by June 30th. MANAGER'S REPORT 7/6/21

- 1. ROAD IMPROVEMENTS AND HEATHERDELL ROAD SIDEWALK:** The curbing work is going very well, although the curbing machine broke down this morning. It is expected to be fixed today and back up and running tomorrow. David is working with the paving contractor to try to have the paving work follow the completed curbing work, rather than waiting for that all to be done in the Fall. This is dependent on the contractor's schedule and the work to be done in the other Rivertowns. The Heatherdell Road sidewalk project is also going well.
- 2. HIGHWAY GARAGE:** The engineering and construction management firms are moving forward on the final design work, including utility locations. We will soon be ready to bring the next level of design to the Mayor and Deputy Mayor and then further information to the full Board. The consultants are also working on the design of the access road through the Greenburgh property in anticipation of bidding that work in the next month or two, pending final agreement with the Town of Greenburgh on easement language.

Manager's Report 8/2/2021

I am told there will be sufficient time for some words to be said by those in attendance.
6. **Open Meetings Law**

By action taken at an emergency session of the New York State Legislature, due to concerns about the current transmission of COVID-19, municipal boards once again have the right to virtually meet or convene in person without allowing public in-person access to the meeting. Meetings can be held fully in-person for board members and the public, via conference call or similar service for board members and the public, as well as in a hybrid model, allowing for both in-person and virtual access. There is no requirement that a board adopt a local law or resolution to take advantage of this alternative meeting option. However, meetings must be appropriately noticed and the public must be made aware as to how to access all public meetings. This legislation goes into effect immediately and will be repealed on January 15, 2022. The law is located in Part E on page 35 of the legislation: OML Amendment.

The municipal board must provide the public access to view or listen to the proceedings of the board. Additionally, the meeting must be recorded and transcribed at a later date.
7. **125th Celebration** The Contract for the Fireworks has been signed and will be ratified tonight. With the kind assistance of the Dobbs Ferry Superintendent of School, the fireworks will be held at the Middle School. There are many more activities scheduled and waiting for October 10th – Stay tuned
